Our Work Programme for 2024/2025



We started our 2024/2025 work projects earlier in the year around:

Patient Experience of Cancer Services at Walsall Manor Hospital

Healthwatch Walsall are wanting to gain an understanding of the patient experience of those who have used cancer services in Walsall. We want to find out about whether service users were happy with the treatment and care they received.

We want to find out if people were treated with compassion, felt safe, were listened to and whether they were provided with support and information needed. An overall report will be produced with recommendations included and once finalised and approved this will be shared with stakeholders and partners, together with being published on our website.

Patient Experience of Urology Services at Walsall Manor Hospital

Healthwatch Walsall are wanting to gain an understanding of the patient experience of those who have used urology services in Walsall. We want to find out about whether service users were happy with the treatment and care they received.

We want to find out if people were treated with compassion, felt safe, were listened to and whether they were provided with support and information needed. An overall report will be produced with recommendations included and once finalised and approved this will be shared with stakeholders and partners, together with being published on our website.

We have also undertaken additional work contributing towards a larger project around eye care surgery being run by Healthwatch England. We were able to provide some interesting intelligence about people waiting for eye care. Healthwatch England aim to publish the overall report in January 2025 and following this, we will publish our local report which will be available on our website.

Pharmacy First

The Pharmacy First scheme was launched by the government and NHS England on 31 January 2024 to give patients quick and accessible care and ease pressure on GP services. Pharmacy First builds on previous service provision under the Community Pharmacist Consultation Service (CPCS) and enables the public to access community pharmacies and be provided with advice, prescription medication or referral to another healthcare professional by a pharmacist. There are seven common conditions that community pharmacists are now able to provide prescription medication directly to patients for when appropriate as well as the services that were provided under the previous CPCS.



Enter and View update



What is Enter and View

Part of Healthwatch Walsall remit is to carry out Enter and View visits. Healthwatch Walsall Authorised Representatives carry out these visits to health and social care premises to find out how they are being run and make recommendations where there are areas for improvement.

The Health and Social Care Act allows Authorised Representatives to observe service delivery and talk to service users, their families, and carers on premises such as hospitals, residential homes, GP practices, dental surgeries, optometrists, and pharmacies.

Enter and View visits can happen if people tell us there is a problem with a service but, equally, they can occur when services have a good reputation so that we can learn about and share examples of what they do well from the perspective of people who experience the service first-hand.

Healthwatch Walsall Enter and View visits are not intended to specifically identify safeguarding issues. However, if safeguarding concerns arise during a visit, they are reported in accordance with Healthwatch Walsall Safeguarding Policy, the service manager will be informed, and the visit will end. The Local Authority Safeguarding Team will also be informed.

Do you wish you could use the internet but don't have a computer or smartphone?

Maybe you need a bit of help getting online and knowing how to get the best out of your device?

Black Country Connected is an NHS-run programme that can lend you a Geobook laptop for three months, so that you can get online and:

- Access healthcare information and appointments
- Explore education and employment opportunities
- Do your shopping or banking
- Stay connected to others through social media and email.

Our computer experts will give you the training you need to use the device and explore the internet. If you decide you want to learn more, we can give you details of free IT courses offered by colleges across the Black Country as well as online courses to help improve your digital skills.

If you get on well with your device during the loan period, you may be able to keep it. All we ask in return is that you answer some questions to help us understand people's digital skills/usage better, so we can provide further opportunities in the future to assist people to engage with services/get online.

The Bereavement Journey at Aldridge Methodist Church, Anchor Road, Aldridge, Walsall, WS9 8PT on Mondays from 2pm to 4pm on November 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th & December 2nd, & 9thwith an optional faith session on December 16th.

What is The Bereavement Journey?

The Bereavement Journey is a 7-session series of films and discussion groups that gently guides bereaved people through the most common aspects of grief and bereavement to help them process their loss. Facilitated by volunteers, any person bereaved at any time is helped to consider for themselves the implications of their bereavement and to discern the next steps. For most people The Bereavement Journey provides the tools they need, either to process their loss without one-to-one professional assistance or to identify where further support might help.

Why is The Bereavement Journey important?

Bereavement is one of the most stressful times in life and loss needs to be processed. The Bereavement Journey provides a safe space for bereaved people to talk with others who understand the pain of grief, to explore the impact of their loss and consider ways they might resolve issues they are facing, for a healthy and positive future.

Who is The Bereavement Journey for?

Any bereaved person 18 years and over, bereaved of anyone at any time, by death, and will also help those who are in anticipatory grief. Many people attend The Bereavement Journey in the months following the death, but others may find their grief surfacing from an unprocessed death from years beforehand or want to explore how a past bereavement might have affected them.

How much does The Bereavement Journey cost?

We ask for a donation of £10 per person, which includes the Guest Manual. But we would not want cost to prevent someone attending.


